Report No. 4 (April 2024) from Michael Kamara, Kontha Community School, Sierra Leone

Since my return in January, construction work in Kontha is going on. The additional forth classroom has been completed with a zinc roof, ceiling work is done, all windows with ventilation tiles are installed and all walls are plastered. School furniture is built and assembled on site. The four toilets have been built, plastered, bowls, doors and zinc roof installed. Even during Ramadan, work was ongoing, with the goal to have all school construction finished before the rainy season starts in May.











Thanks to your donations over \$3,355 by end of March, matched by \$3,000 from a supporting donor, all funds to build the water well (Stage 2) have been raised. The manual well digging has reached the water level, and work to stabilize the well walls has started. For this, many bags of cement and iron rods have been purchased, and the whole community helps with bringing sand and water to the construction site. A metal water pump lifter is purchased and will soon be installed.
